

Freshman Intercultural Relations Study Trip

The FIRST Program is an Off-campus Study Program for first-year students. It's also the most popular Off-campus Study Program at APU. Without a doubt, the most defining characteristic of the program is its spirit of adventure. As soon as students arrive at the program site, they draw straws to select local destinations, which can even include small cities not normally visited by tourists. Being unfamiliar with the local language, students must rely on their own abilities to make their way to the destination and administer a questionnaire to over two hundred people. Students from the same language basis are put together in small groups, where they work on their communication skills and understanding of different cultures and acquire the skills for making the most of their life on APU's multicultural campus.

SECOND

SEIf CONfirmation and Development program

Southeast Asia is a region of diverse languages, religions, and cultures. In the SECOND Program, first to third semester students deepen their understanding of cultural diversity by traversing four Southeast Asian countries and conducting a survey along the way. Both domestic and international students can participate in this program and classes are integrated, proceeding bilingually in Japanese and English. One major advantage of this program is that even first to third semester students who are not yet comfortable with their language ability can study together without fear of making mistakes. If you are interested in learning the fundamentals of field research and performing high-level multicultural collaborative learning, then this program is for you.

Strengthening language skills and the ability to adapt to different cultures through foreign language immersion

AP Language Immersion Program

Held at foreign universities or affiliated language schools during summer or spring breaks, the AP Language Immersion Program is an intensive language learning program aimed at boosting students' language abilities. Students gain practical language skills and learn about the host country's culture and customs by immersing themselves in a foreign environment, interacting with local communities, and participating in activities that develop their intercultural adaptability. In order to take full advantage of educational opportunities in the host country, programs combine pre- and post-program lectures, with the latter helping students reflect on their learning in the host country and link it to their future studies at APU.

"NIHONGO Partners" Program

Working people of all ages are sent to Asia, primarily to 10 ASEAN countries, undertaking the role of "partners" for local Japanese teachers and students studying Japanese, with a focus on secondary education institutions. Students support Japanese language education in Asia as classroom assistants and conversation partners, as well as by contributing to Japanese language and cultural activities inside and outside the classroom.

Additionally, the 8-month program includes close interaction with the local community to deepen students' understanding of the local language and culture, with the goal of building bridges of friendship between Japan and the countries of the ASEAN region. Field Study / Field Research Project

This program enables students to carry out field work and research in a specialized field of each college under the guidance of a faculty member, deepens students' interest in their chosen field, and serves as a bridge between theory and practice.

Students in the College of Asia Pacific Studies will develop a strong interest in specialized study. First-year students take part in a program focused on the four fields of "Environment and Development," "International Relations," "Tourism and Hospitality," and "Culture, Society and Media." Second-year students and above complete specialized research in each field. For students in the College of International Management, this program grants a business perspective against the backdrop of multinational corporations and focuses on social entrepreneurs practicing social change. These programs provide field experience, deepen theme-related knowledge through pre- and post-program classes, and foster knowledge and skills.

The program is a supplementary study for students interested in learning about diffusion and acceptance of innovations in society moving toward sustainability. Students will experience and explore good practices in Kitakyushu city, as the first Asian Green Growth City reported by OECD in 2013. Being exposed and having the chance to learn from the policies, strategies, innovations and technologies, culture and values of the city, and experiencing the Japanese best practices concept, the field study will provide a platform for students to study and develop their knowledge and skills of finding practical solutions for a sustainable community.



SOLVE (SOciaL innoVation and Entrepreneurship)

ALCANTARA Lailani L. Professor (APM)

SOLVE is an experiential and field training program that teaches students how to put business concepts into practice through social innovation and social enterprises. One of the program sites, the Philippines, is a notable member of the ASEAN countries with a very high rate of economic and population growth.

During the program, students take part in a hands-on activity sponsored by local organizations dedicated to training social entrepreneurs. This activity brings together students, social entrepreneurs, and local people to teach how businesses can make an impact on society. Students are divided into groups and will search for solutions from business-oriented solutions to a wide range of issues, including poverty, unemployment, hunger, food access, and quality of education.

Independently design and implement a research project in the real world

APU Global Research Program (AGR)

- "Why is it said that Sweden is a welfare state?"
- "What are the differences between Korea and Japan?"
- "Taiwan a country of traditions and trends. What is it really like?"
- "I enjoyed traveling around Vietnam, and I want to get to know the country better."

Through this program, students will acquire research skills related to their interests in each APS area of study. By requiring students to develop research questions related to specific issues, this program grants students the skills to gather relevant information and make proper preparations for conducting research. In the practicum, students take a hands-on approach based on their research plan at each program site and compile their results into a report.

This program takes into account the opinions of students and offers them the chance to take on a research theme based on their own interests. Students will learn about research methods prior to departure. They will develop research plans which they will conduct and find their own answers to at the program site. Although Sweden is known as an environmentally advanced country, this program will allow students to find out the reality of the Swedish people's lifestyles. For example, how does Sweden differ from Japan? What is the country's take on education and government matters? Find out the truth for yourself!

Korea has long been called a 'close but distant country' to Japan. Korean people are perhaps the most similar to Japanese people. They eat white rice, drink miso soup and use chopsticks. It is the fact that they are so similar, that we are often drawn to the small differences. Domestic Exchange Program

Under the Domestic Exchange Program, students study for six months or a full year as exchange students at Ritsumeikan University (Kyoto City, Kyoto Prefecture; Kusatsu City, Shiga Prefecture; Ibaraki City, Osaka Prefecture)

Credits earned while on this program can be transferred back to APU upon the students' return. Based on the Student Exchange agreement, students pay tuition to APU during the program, and are exempt from paying tuition to Ritsumeikan University.

In addition to the six-month and year-long programs, Ritsumeikan University also offers a short-term program where students can enroll in courses during summer break. As with the exchange program, credits earned on this program can be transferred back to APU.

Overseas Student Exchange Program

The Overseas Student Exchange Program sends students overseas to study at a partner university for six months or one year. At their host university, students primarily take regular curriculum courses to complement their specialization. Students continue paying APU tuition fees without paying additional tuition fees to their host university and begin their exchange one year after submitting an application. Classes conducted in English are also available at partner universities in non-English-speaking countries.


