



■ Sushi of Osaka

Sushi made in a small wooden box is a delightful Osaka treat. In Osaka, it is considered a delicacy for a celebration.

Konamon (flour-based dishes) Culture: Overflowing with history and tradition.

Okonomiyaki, rumored to first been made when *Sen No Rikyu* served "fu-no-yaki," or baked wheat, at his tea ceremonies. As a food where anyone can put whatever they like, hence the name, it has become the representative soul food of Osaka. The amount of families that own a *takoyaki* machine in Osaka is far beyond any other prefecture, proving that the love Osaka people have for *Konamon* is as hot as the sun.

Okonomiyaki

The representative *Konamon* dish made with a base of flour and cabbage. You can put meat, squid or any other ingredients. At some restaurants, you can bake it yourself.



This shrine has long been a place of veneration of a deity who cures dembo (tumors and boils). The sando (the approach to the shrine), lined with fortune-telling booths, food shops, kampo (traditional Chinese medicine) shops and eateries, is also popular among visitors.



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



Basic travel information

Service

● Wi-Fi and internet information

In Osaka, various locations such as main railroad stations, tourist facilities and convenience stores offer public LAN services to help tourists have a pleasant stay. Downloading the “Kansai Free Wi-Fi” app will make it even more convenient.



● Postal service

The logo of the post office is a red “〒” against a white background. The open hours are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. but some city post offices have extended hours. Osaka central Post Office, open 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Osaka North Post Office, open 24 hours For English inquiries ☎0570-046-111 (call charges apply)



● Taxi

If the lamp on the dashboard of the taxi is red, it's available to ride. It might cost more than public transportation but in a party of 3-4 people it could be a better choice. The rear door on the left opens automatically so watch out. Prices are listed inside the taxi and receipts are also issued. In the city, taxis also accept most credit cards.



Money

● Cash, Credit Card and ATM information

Usually credit cards will be accepted but Japan is generally a cash based society, so some places may not accept them. It is best to carry some cash. Furthermore, not all ATMs feature an international card withdrawal feature. At Seven Bank and Japan Post Bank, the ATMs allow for foreign issued credit and debit cards to withdraw in Japanese yen.

● Currency

Japanese currency is available in 1,000-yen, 2,000-yen, 5,000-yen and 10,000-yen bills, and 1-yen, 5-yen, 10-yen, 50-yen, 100-yen and 500-yen coins. Currency can be exchanged at large banks, airports, currency exchange shops and post offices.



● Tipping


There is no custom of tipping in Japan.

● Service fee and table charge

At hotels and some restaurants, a service charge may be applied when paying. Also, drinking establishments like “Izakaya” etc. may provide an appetizer called “Otoshi” or “Tsukidashi” that serves as a table charge.

● Yearly temperature and rain for Osaka




In Japan, the climate changes throughout the 4 seasons.

In June there is the rainy season called “Tsuyu” and from September to October there is “Typhoon” season.

● Designated Public Non-Smoking Zone

Designated public non-smoking zone means that it is prohibited to smoke on the street. Violators will be punished with a fine. In Osaka, the main street “Midosuji” from Umeda to Namba as well as the area around Osaka City Hall and Shinsaibashi-suji are public non-smoking zones (the red line on the right). Apart from these areas, please take care not to inconvenience or bother people when smoking.



● Electricity (Plugs and voltage)

The voltage in Japan is 100V AC. 60Hz is used in west Japan including Osaka. The plug type is the same as North America with 2 pins. 3 pin plugs will require an adapter.
