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1. Qualitative Information of Consolidated Performance during the Quarter under Review

(1) Explanation of Operating Results

The business environment of the human resources market where the en-japan Group operates continues to show a favorable trend as can be seen from the jobs-to-applicant ratio that reached 1.09 in September 2014.

Under such circumstances, the Group conducted a full-scale renewal of [en] Career Change Info in its job advertisement business and has been striving to improve user-friendliness and enhance product appeal.

Furthermore, the Group has strengthened two job placement services, one at its subsidiary en World Japan K.K. and the other at en-japan's en agent.

Concerning overseas development, with a view to promoting business operations on a Group-wide basis, the Group changed the company name of "The Capstone Group Recruitment and Consulting (Thailand) Ltd." to "en world Recruitment (Thailand) Co., Ltd."

As a result, the Company recorded net sales of \$9,205 million (up 23.0% on a year-on-year basis), operating income of \$1,738 million (up 7.5% on a year-on-year basis), ordinary income of \$1,921 million (up 5.1% on a year-on-year basis). Net income declined to \$1,177 million (down 49.2% on a year-on-year basis) since the Company had recorded a gain on sales of investment securities of \$1,998 million a year earlier.

Operating results by segment are as follows (net sales include internal sales).

[1] Hiring Business

The Hiring Business comprises management of job advertisement website, provision of job placement services, and operations at overseas subsidiaries, among others.

(Job advertisement website)

As a result of reinforcing sales of the Group's mainstay [en] Career Change Info to new customers, the number of job listings increased year on year. Other websites also performed well; as a result, all of the other websites achieved higher net sales compared to the same period of the previous fiscal year.

(Job placement service)

Due to strong hiring demand from multinational companies, the company's subsidiary en Japan K.K. generated sound operating results. In addition, en agent, a new job placement service launched by en-japan in the previous fiscal year, saw a steady increase in the number of new employees and net sales by each quarter.

(Overseas subsidiaries)

Net sales from overseas subsidiaries grew significantly year on year because full-year operating results of consolidated subsidiaries in Thailand and Vietnam have been included in the consolidated operating results starting from the beginning of the fiscal year under review.

As a result, net sales were \(\frac{\pma}{8}\),914 million (up 23.2% on a year-on-year basis), and operating income were \(\frac{\pma}{1}\),760 million (up 12.0% on a year-on-year basis) for the cumulative second quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015.

[2] Education/Evaluation Business

The Education/Evaluation Business comprises a flat-rate training service and provision of recruiting and personnel-related system, among others

(Flat-rate training service)

The Company renewed en-College in May 2014 and strengthened marketing activities aimed at new clients. As a result, the number of client companies and net sales grew from the same period of the prior fiscal year.

(Recruiting and personnel-related system)

Net sales increased year on year as repeat orders of a consolidated subsidiary Cbase Corporation grew.

As a result, net sales were \(\frac{\pmathbb{3}}{317}\) million (up 17.0% on a year-on-year basis). On the profit front, the Company posted an operating loss of \(\frac{\pmathbb{2}}{22}\) million (against an operating income of \(\frac{\pmathbb{4}}{44}\) million in the same period of the previous fiscal year) mainly due to a rise in personnel expenses following an increase in the number of staff to support the Company's business expansion.

(2) Explanation of Financial Position

Analysis of Financial Position

Total assets at the end of the second quarter of the fiscal year ending in March 31, 2015 decreased \quantum 773 million compared to the end of the previous fiscal year to \quantum 21,960 million.

Current assets decreased \(\pmu2,363\) million to \(\pmu13,450\) million. This was mainly due to a decrease of cash and deposits of \(\pmu2,474\) million following payment of income taxes payable. Noncurrent assets increased \(\pmu1,590\) million to \(\pmu8,510\) million. This was primarily attributable to an increase of goodwill of \(\pmu400\) million following an acquisition of a subsidiary's shares, which led to a change in the scope of consolidation.

Total liabilities at the end of the second quarter of the fiscal year under review were \$4,159 million, a decrease of \$1,438 million compared to the end of the previous fiscal year.

Current liabilities decreased \$1,484 million to \$3,694 million. This mainly stemmed from a decrease of income taxes payable of \$1,325 million. Noncurrent liabilities rose \$45 million to \$464 million. This was primarily due to an increase in asset retirement obligations of \$26 million.

Total net assets were \$17,801 million, up \$665 million compared to the end of the previous fiscal year.

This was mainly attributable to an increase in retained earnings of \$599 million yen as a result of registering net income of \$1,177 million and paying out a dividend of \$578 million.

Analysis of Cash Flows

Cash and cash equivalents at the end of the second quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015 decreased \$2,474 million from the previous fiscal year to \$10,694 million.

Changes in the respective cash flows in the cumulative second quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015 and their factors are described as follows.

(Cash Flows from Operating Activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities in the cumulative second quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015 were \$(142) million (against \$1,096 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was primarily a result of posting income before income taxes and minority interests of \$1,905 million, which was reduced by income taxes paid of \$1,919 million.

(Cash Flows from Investing Activities)

Net cash provided by investing activities in the cumulative second quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015 were $\S(1,777)$ million (against $\S(64)$ million in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This mainly consisted of cash used for purchase of investments in subsidiaries resulting in a change in the scope of consolidation of $\S596$ million and cash used for purchase of intangible assets of $\S557$ million.

(Cash Flows from Financing Activities)

Net cash provided by financing activities in the cumulative second quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015 were \$(596) million (against \$(478) million in the same period of the previous

fiscal year). This mainly consisted of cash dividend paid of ¥577 million.

(3) Changes in Accounting Policy, Changes in Accounting Estimates, or Restatement due to Correction

The Company has adopted the "Practical Solution on Transactions of Delivering the Company's Own Stock to Employees, etc., through Trusts" (PITF No. 30 issued by the Accounting Standards Board of Japan on December 25, 2013) starting from the first quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015. Accordingly, the Company recognizes dividends from the Company for shares held by the trust and miscellaneous expenses concerning the trust to liabilities on a net basis.

This change in accounting policy was applied retroactively; consequently, the consolidated financial statements for the second quarter of the previous fiscal year and for the full previous fiscal year present the results after retroactive application.

As a result, noncurrent liabilities at the end of the previous fiscal year increased \\$51,066 thousand, and retained earnings and treasury stock decreased \\$51,295 thousand and \\$228 thousand, respectively, compared to the amount before retroactive application.

2 Information concerning impairment loss or goodwill on fixed assets by segment

(Significant change in amount of goodwill)

Because the Company acquired shares of New Era India Consultancy Pvt. Ltd. in the first quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015, there has been a significant change to the amount of goodwill in the "Hiring Business" segment. The amount of goodwill booked as a result of the acquisition is \(\frac{\pma}{2}\)533,626 thousand.

3. Matters related to changes in the reporting segment

The Company decided to terminate operation of its job advertisement website in the new graduate recruitment business at the end of March 2015 and change its business model. For this reason, the Company has changed its operating segment to "Hiring Business" and "Education/Evaluation Business" starting from the first quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2015.

Figures presented in the segment information for the second quarter of the fiscal year ended March 31, 2014 reflect the classification change following the change in the segment
