帰国後はN響での演奏を中心にしつつ、ソロや室内楽でも積極的に活動している。

横浜市イギリス館にてトーク付きのサロン・コンサートシリーズ「旅するヴァイオリン」を毎月開催。横浜市開港記念会館と横浜みなとみらいホールを拠点に活動するNPO法人「ハマのJACK」では、演奏会を年4公演のほか、子供たちを対象としたワークショップも開催している。

N響メンバーによる弦楽四重奏団「クアルテット・リゾナンツァ」では、銀座ヤマハホールにおいてベートーヴェン弦楽四重奏曲全曲演奏シリーズを開催。

また、銀座王子ホールにて毎年リサイタルを開催、意欲的なプログラミングで好評を博している。ヴァイオリンを名取美保、守岡輝、日高毅、篠崎功子、アレクサンダー・アレンコフの各氏に師事。現在、クアルテット・リゾナンツァ 1st violin、室内オーケストラ「ARCUS」メンバー、NPO法人「ハマのJACK」副理事。国立音楽大学および附属中学・高校非常勤講師。NHK交響楽団2ndヴァイオリン・次席奏者。

Atsushi Shirai (Violinist)

Atsushi Shirai graduated from the Toho Gakuen School of Music after completing his studies at the Senior High School Attached to Kunitachi College of Music. In 1999, he joined the NHK Symphony Orchestra. In 2003, he studied in Vienna as a scholarship recipient of the Affinis Cultural Foundation, receiving instruction from Alexander Arencov. He gave his debut recital in Vienna in 2004.

Since returning to Japan, Shirai has been active not only with the NHK Symphony Orchestra but also as a soloist and chamber musician. He presents a monthly salon concert series with talks, Tabisuru Violin ("Traveling Violin"), at the Yokohama British House. As a core member and vice director of the Yokohama-based NPO "Hama no JACK," he performs four concerts annually and also leads workshops for children at Yokohama Kaikō Kinen Kaikan and Yokohama Minato Mirai Hall.

As the first violinist of the Quartet Risonanza, formed by members of the NHK Symphony Orchestra, he has performed the complete Beethoven string quartet cycle at Yamaha Hall in Ginza. He also gives an annual recital at Oji Hall in Ginza, receiving high acclaim for his imaginative programming. His principal teachers include Miho Natori, Akira Morioka, Takeshi Hidaka, Kohko Shinozaki, and Alexander Arencov.

Shirai currently serves as first violinist of Quartet Risonanza, a member of the chamber orchestra ARCUS, vice director of the NPO "Hama no JACK," and associate principal second violin of the NHK Symphony Orchestra. He also teaches as a part-time lecturer at Kunitachi College of Music and its affiliated junior high and high schools.
