In America there is a TV show called Fear Factor. On this show, people have to face their fears. For example, if a woman on the show is afraid of cockroaches, she might have to hold one, or even eat one! The TV show is

kind of strange, but it is a good idea to face our fears.

Some people are afraid of the water, but it is still good for them to learn how to swim. Children might be afraid to go to school, but they have to face this fear as well. We teach them that facing fear is part of life. But most of us still have fears that we don't want to face; fears so big we think we can never conquer them. What can we do about fears this big? In a world full of fear, how can we learn to live fearlessly?

Reading God's Word

Proverbs 1:7

The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; fools <u>despise</u> wisdom and instruction.

Isaiah 8:11-13

11 With his great power the Lord warned me not to follow the road which the people were following. He said, 12 "Do not join in the <u>schemes</u> of the people and do not be afraid of the things that they fear. 13 Remember that I, the Lord <u>Almighty</u>, am holy; I am the one you must fear.

16 Those who live in love live in <u>union</u> with God and God lives in union with them. . . **18** There is no fear in love; perfect love <u>drives out</u> all fear. So then, love has not been made perfect in anyone who is afraid, because fear has to do with punishment.
