Reading God's Word

When Jesus was dying on the cross, there were two thieves hanging on crosses beside him. He showed love to these criminals, but only one responded to that love.

Luke 23:39-43

39 One of the criminals hanging there <u>hurled insults</u> at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" 40 The other one, however, <u>rebuked</u> him, saying, "Don't you fear God? You received the same <u>sentence</u> he did. 41 Ours, however, is only right, because we are getting what we deserve for what we did; but he has done no wrong." 42 And he said to Jesus, "Remember me, Jesus, when you come as King!" 43 Jesus said to him, "I promise you that today you will be in Paradise with me."

John 3:16

16 For God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not die but have <u>eternal</u> life.

1 John 4:18-19


18 There is no fear in love; perfect love <u>drives out</u> all fear. So then, love has not been made perfect in anyone who is afraid, because fear has to do with punishment. 19 We love because God first loved us.

Romans 8:38-39

38 For I am certain that nothing can separate us from his love: neither death nor life, neither angels nor other heavenly rulers or powers, neither the present nor the future, 39 neither the world above nor the world below—there is nothing in all creation that will ever be able to separate us from the love of God which is ours through Christ Jesus our Lord.

- 7. Who or what might try to separate us from God's love? How? (Romans 8:38-39)

Taking Action

- 1. God loves you. It gives him pleasure when you include him in every part of your life. What can you do to remind yourself to think of him more, and talk to him more each day?
- 2. God says in the Bible, "I will never leave you; I will never <u>abandon</u> you," but sometimes he feels very far away. How can we remind ourselves of God's love in these difficult times?
