#### ATTACHING AND REMOVING THE LENS

Remove the rear cap of the lens. Align the lens attachment mark  $\widehat{T}$  and mounting mark on the camera, and then insert the lens. Turn the lens clockwise for Sony E / FUJIFILM X mounts or counterclockwise for Nikon Z mounts until it locks. To remove the lens, turn the lens in the opposite direction while pressing the lens release button on the camera.



• Turn off the power of the camera before attaching or removing the lens.

### SWITCHING FOCUS MODE (Ref. Figs. 1, 2, 2)

For Sony E: AF/MF Switching (Ref. Figs. 1, 2)

To shoot using autofocus (AF), set both the camera and the AF/MF switch (18) on the lens to "AF". (Ref. Fig. 2) (If the lens is set at "MF", it will not autofocus.)

To shoot using manual focus (MF), set the camera and/or the lens AF/MF switch ® to "MF". For manual focus, turn the focus ring 9 to acquire the focus. (Ref. Figs. 1, 2)

### ■ For FUJIFILM X: MF SPEED Switching (Ref. Figs. 1, 2)

When you choose "MANUAL FOCUS" on the camera body, you may select the focus response speed by the selector switch ® on the lens.

MODE 1 For normal focusing, average response speed

MODE 2 For precise focusing, slower response speed

#### ■ For Nikon Z: LINEAR/NON-LINIER Switching (Ref.Figs. 1, 2)

Under the MF mode setting, the focusing method of the focus ring ③ can be changed using the LINEAR/NON-LINEAR switch ⑤.

NON-LINEAR The rotation speed of the focus ring ③ changes the amount of focus movement.

LINEAR The rotation angle of the focus ring ⑨ changes the amount of focus movement.



- Under AF mode, there may be difficulty for autofocus to work depending on the subject.
- For Sony E mount lens, if your camera features an AF/MF control button, it is possible to temporarily switch to MF from AF by pressing the AF/MF control button. When the lens set to "AF" and the camera set to "MF", by pressing the AF/MF control button you may temporarily switch the focus to AF.
- For Nikon Z, under the AF mode setting, the focus ring (9) will act as "Control Ring" and can apply functions from the camera.

### CONNECTOR PORT (Ref. Fig. 1) \*For Nikon Z only

Lenses with the connector port @ can be connected to a computer using the TAMRON connection cable (sold separately). Then, using the dedicated "TAMRON Lens Utility "" application, you will be able to update the firmware.

### VIBRATION COMPENSATION (Ref. Figs. 1, 5, 6)

#### For Sony E / FUJIFILM X

To compensate for the vibrations, set the VC (Vibration Compensation) switch (9) to ON. (Ref. Fig. 5)

#### ■ Switching the modes (Ref. Fig. 6)

You can switch the modes by using the VC mode switch @.

MODE 1 Basic vibration compensation mode

MODE 2 Panning mode

MODE 3 Mode that prioritizes framing. Makes it easier to maintain subjects moving quickly within the frame.

\* MODE 1 and MODE 3 do not support panning.

#### For Nikon Z

For vibration compensation, the lens do not have a switch for vibration compensation, please activate the function from the camera body.

- Vibration compensation is effective under the following conditions
  - Dimly lit locations
  - · Locations where flash photography is prohibited
  - Locations where tripod cannot be used
- Vibrations may not be compensated sufficiently under the following conditions
  - When a photograph is taken from a vehicle that is shaking greatly
  - · Shooting during excessive movement of the camera
  - · When shooting while using a tripod
  - Set the VC switch (1) to OFF when taking pictures with bulb photography (long exposures). Otherwise, vibration compensation may cause a malfunction. (For Nikon Z, the lens do not have a switch for vibration compensation, please activate the function from the camera body)



- When MODE 1 or MODE 2 is set (For Sony E / FUJIFILM X), the viewfinder image may become blurred immediately after
  the shutter button is pressed halfway. This is due to the principles of the vibration compensation mechanism and not a
  malfunction. (For Sony E / FUJIFILM X / Nikon Z)
- When MODE 3 is set, the viewfinder image may become blurred even without touching the shutter button in the case the camera is turned on with the VC switch ((9) set to ON. This is due to the principles of the vibration compensation mechanism and not a malfunction. (For Sony E / FUJIFILM X)
- Set the VC switch (1) to OFF when you are shooting while the camera is secured by something other than your hand (such as a tripod). (For Nikon Z, the lens do not have a switch for vibration compensation, please activate the function from the camera body)
- You may feel the lens rattle when the camera is turned off or when the lens is removed from the camera. This is not a
  malfunction.

### FOCUS LIMITER (Ref. Figs. 11, 7 - 9 for Sony E / 7 - 9 for FUJIFILM X / Nikon Z)

When autofocus is set, switching the focus limiter switch @ can speed up focusing by limiting the focus range.

### For Sony E mount lens

- To limit the autofocus range to subjects from infinity to 3 m (Ref. Fig. 7) Set the focus limiter switch ② to "∞-3m".
- To limit the autofocus range to subjects from infinity to 15 m (Ref. Fig. 8) Set the focus limiter switch ②) to "∞-15m".
- To use the full focus range (Ref. Fig. 9)
  Set the focus limiter switch ② to "FULL".

#### For FUJIFILM X / Nikon Z mount lens

- To limit the autofocus range to subjects from MOD\* to 10 m (Ref. Fig. 7)
  Set the focus limiter switch ② to "MOD-10m".
  - \* MOD: Minimum Object Distance
- To limit the autofocus range to subjects from 10 m to infinity (Ref. Fig. 8") Set the focus limiter switch ② to "10m-∞".
- To use the full focus range (Ref. Fig. 9')
  Set the focus limiter switch (2) to "FULL".

### **ZOOMING (Ref. Fig. 1)**

Turn the zoom ring ⑥ to adjust the focal length (Zoom position) to a desired position.

### WIDE-END ZOOM LOCK (Ref. Figs. 1, 3, 4)

You can lock the zoom ring ⑥ at a focal length of 150 mm to keep it from rotating.

■ Setting the zoom lock (Ref. Fig. 3)

Align 150 mm on the focal length scale (7) with the focal length mark (8). Set the wide-end zoom lock switch (2) to the zoom ring side.

■ Releasing the zoom lock (Ref. Fig. 4)

Set the wide-end zoom lock switch ② to the camera side.



• To zoom, release the lock, and then rotate the zoom ring 6.

### FLEX-Z00M LOCK (Ref. Figs. 1, 10, 11)

This mechanism is intended to stop the lens from zooming inadvertently at any position.

Rotate the zoom ring (6) to the desired zoom position, and then apply the lock after you have determined the position.

#### ■ Setting the zoom lock (Ref. Fig. 10)

Move the zoom ring 6 to the subject side until the white mark is visible.

### ■ Releasing the zoom lock (Ref. Fig. 10)

Move the zoom ring 6 to the camera side



- During activities such as carrying the product, use the wide-end zoom lock to prevent zooming due to its own weight. (Ref. Figs. [1], [3])
- To zoom, release the flex-zoom lock, and then rotate the zoom ring 6.
- Take care not to get your fingers caught while you switch the flex-zoom lock.
- If the camera will not be used for an extended period, release the flex-zoom lock before storage.

### LENS HOOD (Ref. Figs. 1, 12, 13)

A bayonet-type lens hood ① is provided as standard equipment.

We recommend shooting with the hood properly attached because the lens hood eliminates stray light that may affect the picture.

### ■ Using the lens hood (Ref. Fig. 12)

Align the hood attaching alignment mark ② of the hood with the hood release mark ⑤ of the lens.

Rotate the hood ① in the direction of the arrow until the hood locking mark ③ meets the hood release mark ⑤.

### ■ Stowing the lens hood (Ref. Fig. 13)

You can stow the lens hood ① by attaching it in reverse.

Align the hood locking mark 3 of the hood with the hood release mark 5 of the lens.

Rotate the hood ① in the direction of the arrow until the hood attaching alignment mark ② meets the hood release mark ⑤.



• Be aware that the periphery of the photographed image may be darkened if the hood ① is not attached properly.

### TRIPOD MOUNT (Ref. Figs. 1, 14 - 16)

### ■ Attaching and removing the tripod mount (Ref. Figs. 14, 16)

You can attach and remove the tripod mount by loosening tripod mount locking screw @ and then lift the portion with the screw, to open the ring.

When attaching the tripod mount, make sure that the protruding part on the inner side of the tripod mount 0 is inserted into the groove on the lens, and then tightly secure the tripod mount locking screw 2.

If this protruding part is not inserted into the groove on the lens correctly when attaching the tripod mount (0), the lens may be damaged or fall off.

### ■ Changing the directional position of the camera (Ref. Fig. 15)

When you change the directional position of the camera, you can rotate the lens by loosening the tripod mount locking screw @. Align the tripod mount mark on the lens ① with the mark on the tripod mount ⑩.

After determining the shooting position, tightly secure the tripod mount locking screw ② to fix the position.

### ■ Strap hole (Ref. Fig. 1)

You may pass a strap through these holes to prevent the lens from falling.

When using the strap holes (6) of the tripod mount (0), first check that the tripod mount locking screw (2) is firmly tightened, and then attach the strap securely. Note that the lens may fall if the tripod mount (0) or the strap detaches from the lens.



• The A057 tripod mount ① can be attached to an ARCA-SWISS camera platform.

### SAFETY LOCK SCREW (Accessory for the tripod mount) (Ref. Figs. 1, 17)

We recommend attaching the lock screws in accordance with the camera platform type when you use an ARCA-SWISS-standard compatible camera platform or clamp.

### ■ How to use safety lock screws (Ref. Fig. 17)

The safety lock screws (4) prevent the lens/camera from falling from the camera platform when a tripod mount (10) is attached to an ARCA-SWISS-standard compatible camera platform or clamp.

As shown on the figure, use the hexagonal wrench 🚯 to tighten the safety lock screws 4 to the two screw holes 🕄



• After attaching the safety lock screws ③, the screw heads protrude from the tripod mount ⑩ bottom surface to prevent the lens/camera from falling. For this reason, if you are using a camera platform or a clamp other than ARCA- SWISS-standard compatible, you do not need to have them attached.

#### **USAGE PRECAUTIONS**

- An internal focusing (IF) system is employed to reduce the minimum focus distance. The angle of view may be wider than that of lenses with other focusing systems when shooting at a distance less than infinity.
- The lens hood or the lens barrel may block the light from the flash. It is recommended to perform trial shooting in advance.
- Differences in the display systems of cameras may cause to show values different from the maximum and minimum aperture values from the specifications. This is not an indication of an error.
- Do not touch the lens-camera interface contacts @ with your fingers. Otherwise, it may cause a malfunction.
- If the temperature changes suddenly, condensation may form and cause malfunctions.
- •The front lens is covered with stain-proof coating. After removing the dust on the lens surface with a blower or another means, wipe it with a dry cloth.
- Never use benzene, thinner, or other organic solvents to clean the lens.
- Store the lens in a clean and well-ventilated place.

- Do not view the sun or other strong light source directly through the lens or through a camera while using this lens.
- Doing so could cause loss of vision, damage to the lens and/or the camera, and possibly cause the lens and/or camera to ignite.
- Do not dissemble, repair, or modify the lens.
- This could damage the lens or camera.

   Keep the lens out of the reach of small children.
- There is a risk of injury if the lens is dropped or falls down.



This indicates instructions which if not heeded or if performed incorrectly could lead to bodily injury or physical damage

- Do not place lens in direct sunlight or leave it in an extremely hot place such as inside a car. Doing such could damage the internal parts of the lens or cause a fire.
- Always attach the lens cap whenever the lens is not in use.
- When attaching the lens to the camera, ensure that the lens has been properly attached to the camera and firmly locked.

If the lens is not attached properly, it could be difficult to remove or it could fall off causing damage or injury.

- Do not use this lens for any application other than photography.
- Do not carry around the lens while it is still attached to a tripod.
- Regarding the lens equipped with a connector port
  - 1) Place the lens in a stable location when customizing the lens using the dedicated application (TAMRON Lens Utility ™). Make sure not to let it fall or impact the lens.
  - 2) When connecting the lens to a computer, use a Tamron connection cable (sold separately).
- 3) Do not touch the connector port with your fingers or a metal object. Also, prevent dust or water from adhering to the connector port. If the connector port is dirty, it may cause connection problems.
- Tamron will not be responsible for damages caused by a failure, a fire, or other accidents that may
  occur when using an accessory other than Tamron accessories. Note that in case of such damage,
  repair of the Tamron lens will be charged since it is not covered by the warranty.
